Programme Features

Our Bachelor of Nursing (Part-time) for Registered Nurses [BNurs(PT-RN)] is an articulation programme specifically designed for diploma-prepared registered nurses to pursue an undergraduate nursing degree. This credited-based curriculum offers two engaging study streams to equip the experienced nurses with advanced and specialised nursing competencies in pursue of career advancement.

Primary Healthcare Focus

The curriculum encourages students to adopt a health-promoting approach to understanding and addressing the patients and their families' healthcare needs.

Pedagogical Innovations

Various teaching and learning initiatives are adopted to strengthen students' learning experiences, including problem-based learning, simulation, virtual reality, laboratory teaching, flipped classrooms, interactive forum, self-directed learning, and such others.

Research Skills Acquisition

Research literacy and evidence-based learning are incorporated into the curriculum to prepare students for a higher degree through research study.

Student Exchange

Overseas exchange opportunities are provided to enrich students' professional experience of healthcare practices in different cultural contexts and widen their global exposure.

Programme Structure

The part-time honours nursing degree normally extends across two academic years over six semesters, except those who have been granted credits for advanced standing*. It consists of 10 six-credit courses of which eight of them are core courses and two are elective courses from either one of the study streams (Generic Stream and Public Health Stream). Students are required to complete successfully all core courses and the required elective courses for graduation.

* Advanced standing credits may be granted to Professional Diploma holders who have successfully completed equivalent course(s) within 5 years before admission to this curriculum, subject to the University's approval.

Scholarships & Prizes

Entrance Scholarship - Bachelor of Nursing (Part-time) for Registered Nurses

The scholarships shall be awarded each year to students admitted to the Programme on the basis of academic merit upon admission and successful completion of the first year of studies.

Lau Wing Kai Memorial Prizes

The prize shall be awarded to a student who has attained the highest total aggregate of marks in the first year of studies.

BL Wong Memorial Prize in Nursing Studies

The prize shall be awarded to a student who has attained the highest total aggregate of marks in the two years of studies.

Admission Requirements

To be eligible for admission to the programme, a candidate shall:

- comply with the University's General Regulations;
- comply with the Regulations for First Degree Curricula; and
- be registered as a Registered Nurse with the Nursing Council of Hong Kong or hold recognised equivalent qualifications such as Higher Diploma in Nursing / Professional Diploma in Nursing.
