The School of Nursing of the University of Hong Kong is committed to fostering nursing leaders for the community, and to providing a diversified and holistic nursing education that nurtures competent nursing practitioners, researchers and educators. We provide innovative, interdisciplinary and internationalised nursing curricula responding to the complex health needs of the population locally and globally. We also have close links with a range of healthcare settings in Hong Kong, which facilitate the provision of cutting-edge learning environments for our students. The School has developed a strong network with nursing schools in renowned universities internationally, which enables student and academic exchanges as well as research collaboration.



#### Programme Features

The Master of Nursing (MNurs) Programme aims to prepare registered nurses for advanced and specialised nursing practice. We provide a broad-spectrum of clinical, community and management study tracks enabling students to develop their specialty areas. Our curriculum benchmarks with the international standard adopted by top university nursing schools in order to align with the ever-increasing professional educational need for nursing specialisation locally and globally. In addition, the MNurs Programme has been recognised by the Nursing Council of Hong Kong as one of the local clinical master programmes under the "Voluntary Scheme on Advanced and Specialised Nursing Practice".

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The curriculum consists of 2 core courses, 1 concentration course, 3 specialty courses and 3 elective courses related to advanced nursing practice and/or clinical components of the selected specialty. In addition, a capstone experience, which includes a Translational Nursing Research course and a Dissertation or Clinical Research Project, develops students' competencies in evidence-based practice and translating scientific evidence into clinical and public health innovations to improve quality of care.
