Programme Structure

The DNurs offers a 4-year part-time and a 3-year full-time study mode with 3 semesters over each year. Students can choose either Educational Leadership Track or Clinical Leadership Track.

Our areas of expertise include community and primary care, mental health, behavioural change, health promotion and disease prevention, healthy aging, big data management, complementary and alternative medicine, oncology and palliative care, symptoms management, and management of health-related transitions in all phases of life course and simulation education.

Students are required to complete a thesis of 50,000 to 60,000 words that represents an original scientific study grounded in nursing practice and contains material worthy of publication. They are also required to participate in thesis seminars which will serve as forums for presenting their work in progress on a regular basis and hone their research skills.

Scholarships & Sponsorship

Dr Serena Yang Scholarship for DNurs Programme

Two prizes, with HK\$30,000 each, shall be awarded to the newly-admitted candidates who attained a Bachelor's degree with 1st class honours or equivalent outstanding academic achievement; and whose research proposal has demonstrated scientific rigor.

Scholarship for Doctor of Nursing (Full-time)

Two scholarships, each of the value up to 50% of the tuition fee, shall be awarded to non-local students admitted to the curriculum on the basis of academic merit and financial need. Students may be invited to selection interview if necessary.


International Conference Participation Sponsorship

Opportunities are available for students to have educational exchange in renowned international universities, and financial support will be provided to encourage students to present at international conferences.

Admission Requirements

To be eligible for admission to the Curriculum, a candidate shall:

- comply with the University's General Regulations;
- hold a Master's degree in nursing or equivalent disciplines from this University, or a comparable university accepted for this purpose;
- currently hold a Registered Nurse license;
- satisfy the English language requirements as prescribed under the University's Admission Office (<https://portal.hku.hk/tpg-admissions/applying/admission-requirements>); and
- satisfy the application evaluators with (i) a statement of overall career goals and specific research interests; and (ii) an oral justification of their suitability for doctoral education.
