Programme Features

Our Master of Science in Nursing [MSc(Nurs)] is a professional Master's degree designed specifically for individuals who hold a Bachelor's degree in a field other than nursing. This accelerated curriculum is accredited by the Nursing Council of Hong Kong (NCHK), enabling graduates to become Registered Nurses.

The Programme offers a cutting-edge curriculum grounded in evidence-based clinical practice, scholarly inquiry, and leadership. It emphasises the integration of theoretical knowledge with practical skills through methods such as problem-based learning, comprehensive simulation training, and interprofessional education. Students can delve into diverse specialties, including clinical practice, research, and global health, gaining robust bedside nursing education equipped for various healthcare settings. Additionally, the curriculum provides a solid foundation for those looking to further their academic and professional careers post-graduation.

Problem-based Learning

Programme Structure

MSc(Nurs) is a full-time curriculum with 9 semesters spreading across 3 academic years. Its curriculum, consisting of 29 courses in total 204 credits, focuses on quality care, clinical skills and leadership, and is designed to be both research-intensive and research-informed.

Professional Recognition

Graduates who satisfactorily completed all curriculum requirements will be eligible to apply for the registration as a Registered Nurse to the Nursing Council of Hong Kong (NCHK).

Admission Requirements

To be eligible for admission to the Curriculum, candidates shall:

- · comply with the General Regulations;
- · comply with the Regulations for Taught Postgraduate Curricula;
- hold a Bachelor's degree in a non-nursing discipline of University, or a qualification of equivalent standard from our University or another comparable institution accepted for this purpose in recent 5 years normally;
- satisfy the English language requirements as prescribed under the University's Admissions Office (https://aal.hku.hk/tpg/english-language-requirements);
- · meet the 'Minimum Entry Requirements for Training of Registered Nurses' from the NCHK;
- · have a good command of written and spoken English and Chinese (Cantonese); and
- · satisfy the examiners in a qualifying examination if required.
